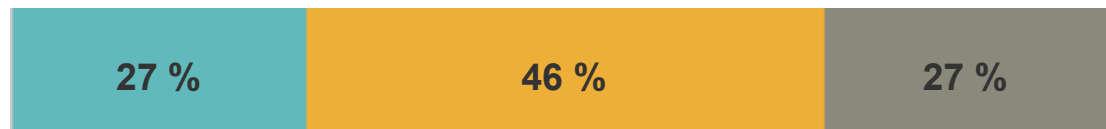

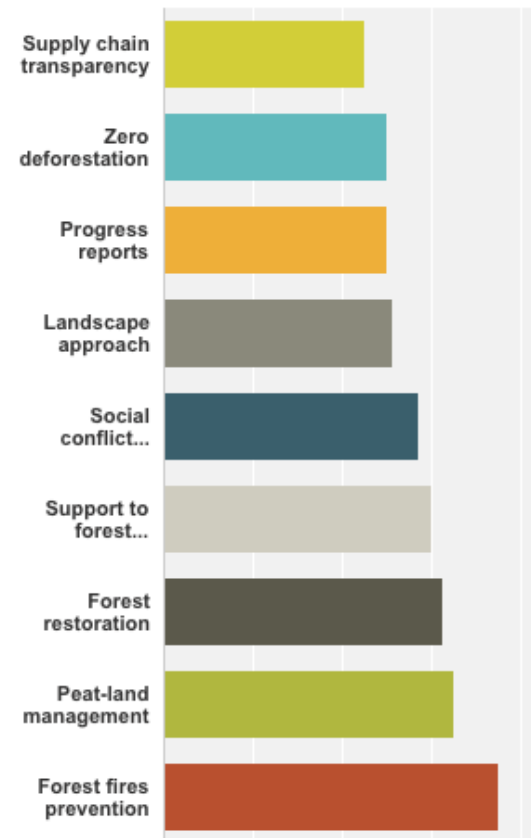
FCP implementation process

- Main **weaknesses** identified

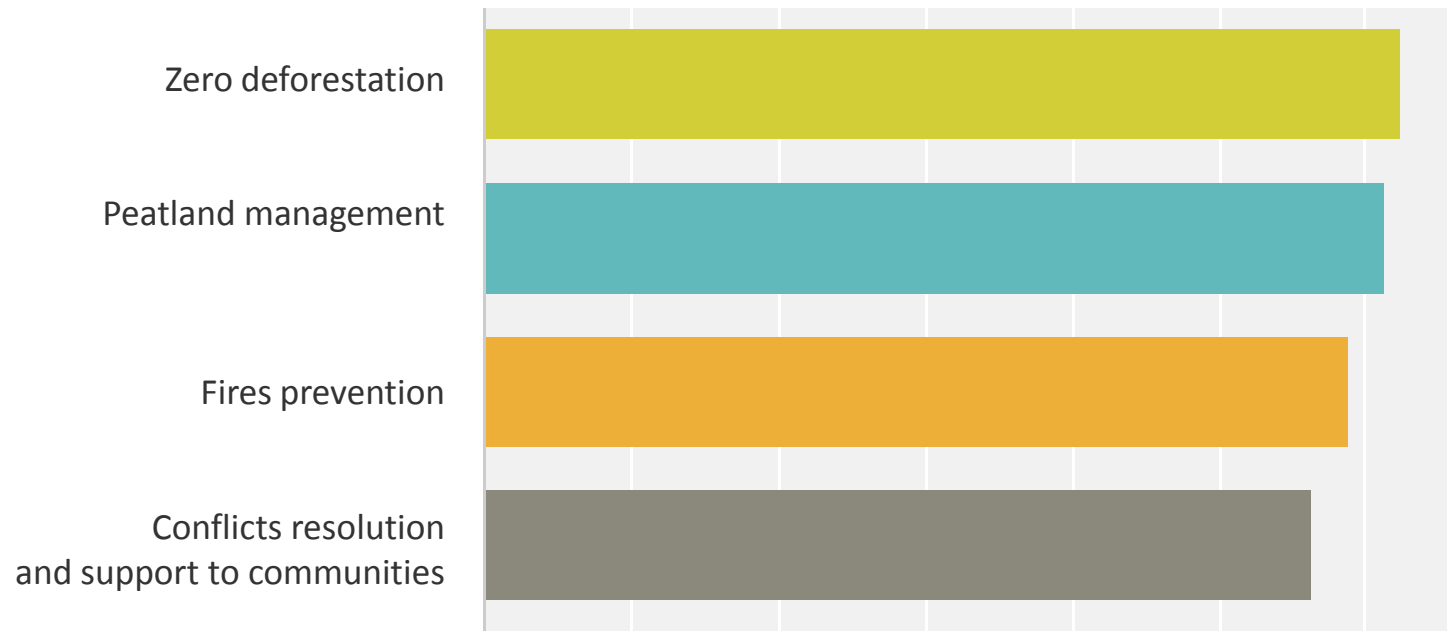
1. Transparency on supply chain

FCP implementation process

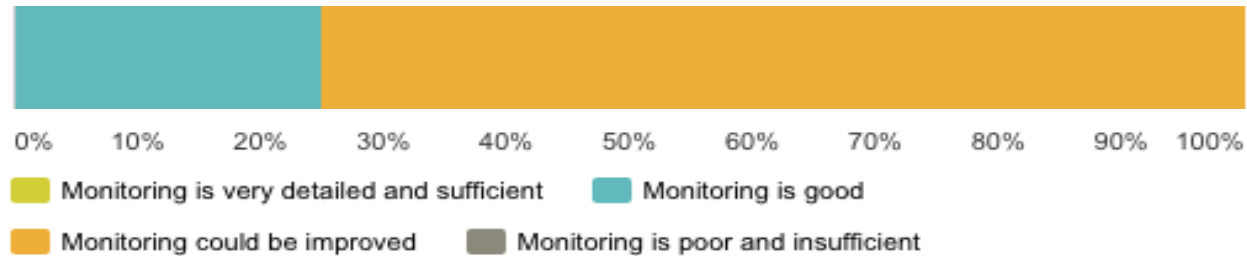
- Main **expectation** for the near future
